

OUTMIGRATION IN ILLINOIS

RESIDENCE AND MIGRATION OF FRESHMEN STUDENTS INTO AND FROM ILLINOIS (2000-2014)*



*This is a combined graphic that includes two scales. The scale on the left is specific to: A) the number of Illinois residents enrolled at out-of-state institutions; and B) the number of non-residents enrolled at Illinois colleges. The scale on the right depicts the net loss of students or A relative to B.

- In 2014, the number of Illinois residents enrolled outside the state continued to climb, while the number of non-residents enrolled in Illinois was down significantly from 2008.
- The net loss of Illinois residents to other states in 2012 and 2014 was roughly 16,500, which is larger than the undergraduate student body of all of our public universities with the exception of three: UIUC, UIC, and ISU.
- The net loss was relatively smaller in both 2006 and particularly in 2008. During that period, enrollment at for-profit private colleges operating in Illinois surged, particularly the number of non-Illinois residents enrolled at such institutions, most of which were enrolled on-line.
- Based on 2014 information, Illinois has the second greatest net loss of residents to colleges in other states (16,623).
- New Jersey (29,101) has traditionally been the net loss leader, along with Illinois, Maryland (8,422) and Texas (8,155).

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

- IBHE is currently establishing a data sharing agreement with the Illinois State Board of Education.
- The purpose of the agreement is to grant IBHE access to information on four recent cohorts of Illinois high school graduates: AY 2012-13; AY 2013-14; AY 2014-15; and AY 2015-16. The data from AY 2015-16 could provide an indication of the potential effects of the budget impasse on college enrollment patterns for high school graduates from Illinois.
- IBHE should be able to gain access to this data in the spring of 2017.
- IBHE is also in the process of developing a data dashboard specific to outmigration.
